Transition Update





We have received the following message from Kids Klobber. We hope it is helpful if you are considering the need to purchase further items of school uniform.

Good afternoon,

In unprecedented times such as this we are still not permitted to open our retail shop however are aiming at continuing to provide a service to all the schools with whom we have an ongoing supply arrangement. To enable us to provide such a service, albeit limited, we have added posts to our Facebook page (Kids Klobber Salisbury) showing the embroidered products we supply for each school, together with prices. We have diverted our shop telephone (01722 321200) to my mobile phone. We have a card machine at home & also the capability for PayPal payments or Direct Bank Transfers (Kids Klobber 30-97-41 a/c 02151297, reference being customer's name). All we ask is that each parent contacts us via Facebook, email or telephone with their orders & we will confirm an anticipated timeframe for delivery or collection at the shop on reopening. If posting there will be a flat fee of £4 per parcel. We will endeavour to also list over the coming days other generic items such as polo shirts, trousers, skirts, shirts & blouses and so on. Due to the limitations on movements we plan only to post on a maximum of two days per week. We also cannot foresee whether there will be any forthcoming supply chain issues as, in spite of trying to stock many British made goods, unfortunately we do have to rely on Foreign imports for some products. Please could you notify your parents & ask that they are patient with us moving forward and we will do our level best to provide all they need for their children. We know that this is going to be a very difficult year for everyone.
