

Devices:

You may be aware that the government are committed to supporting schools during the remote learning phase in the response to Covid-19. We are therefore information gathering as to how our families are accessing the remote learning offer on Seesaw and whether families have enough electronic devices to complete the learning that is set. If you are in a situation where you can only access Seesaw on a smart phone or whether you are dependent on sharing devices with older siblings, meaning that you would benefit from an additional device at home, please may you let us know by emailing

Obviously, we cannot make any guarantees of being able to supply these devices and, when we have got a supply, we may need to prioritise according to need, but we will endeavour to support families where we can. Please note that any devices supplied will be on loan from our school and as such, will remain school property.

Balancing School and Home:

As much as families at home are working to balance home and school, our staff are doing the same. Staff are working on a rota where sometimes they are juggling teaching in the classroom with responding to Seesaw too. We are just so lucky to have such a supportive team that, on some occasions, it may not be your child's class teacher who responds to their work on Seesaw, but we always promise that it will be someone they are familiar with. We are doing this so that children will receive feedback on their work in a timely and meaningful manner. Any additional teachers will always write their name at the end of their comment so that you can clearly identify who it is.

February Progress Reviews:

As was communicated before Christmas, teachers were due to complete a progress report to be sent home in February. Due to the current lockdown arrangements, these will no longer take place in this time frame. Once we have a picture of how things might look moving forward, we will reassess this situation and let parents know. Of course, if you have any questions about your child's progress or current learning targets and developments, please do get in touch with your child's class teacher.

Seesaw:

We are aware that there a great number of things assigned to the children on Seesaw each day. Some of these are teaching videos that do not necessarily require a response (though of course, if you would like to, please do). We just wanted to reassure parents that you do not have to upload anything to 'prove' you have watched the video as we will see this through the children's work. Thank you.

The next 'Something for the Weekend' from Miss Dorrington has been sent to you via your child's Seesaw account. Have fun!

Booking Places:

If your child is attending school on a particular day, this place must be booked using the School Gateway facility. This helps us with the admin and keeping a tally on the numbers for each day. Please book by the Thursday afternoon for the following week. If your child is not booked in, they may be refused entry to school on that day as the place may have been offered to another family. We would hate for there to be any embarrassment or stressful situations at the school gates.

Reminder:

Please only book your child in for the set days that they have been allocated when the request for a critical worker place was made.

Milk and Snacks

We are currently not receiving any milk deliveries from Cool Milk. For families who pay for their child to have milk, we have been asked to inform you that your payments have been carried over until the time when school's are fully open and they begin deliveries again.

The Government's Fruit and Veg Scheme is also on hold at the moment. Therefore, if your child is attending school, please send them in with a healthy snack each day. Thank you.

Critical Worker Letters:

If your child is accessing school provision, we need a copy of your letter to confirm that you are a Critical Worker in Response to Covid-19 if you have not already sent us this, please may you do so by Wednesday 20th January. This is because the school is being held to account for our in-school provision. Letters can be emailed to

Live Teaching:

Some families are wondering if we are intentional about adding any 'live' teaching to our provision. We are currently considering this. However, as our children are so young, we recognise that this may come with additional difficulties in terms of needing to supervise them as well as having the correct devices available at that specific time. We will also need to ensure that it has been thoroughly risk assessed. Of course, we will let you know if this is something we are pursuing further in due course.
