



Just for you information, the teacher training days on Thursday 25th and Friday 26th June have been **cancelled**. School provision will continue to operate as 'normal'.




Summer Reading Challenge

Keyworker Parents

It is important that you let us know **every week** whether your child needs breakfast club, after school club **and** if you need them to stay in school on Friday afternoons of whether they will be collected at lunchtime. This is so that we can plan staffing carefully to not 'contaminate' the bubbles. Thank you.

Update from our link school, Singino Primary School, Tanzania

This week, we received an email from Teresa from EdUKaid to give us an update on how things are going at our link school in Tanzania. She writes: Over the past few weeks our Tanzanian team have been busy distributing masks and soap to children and families across the district – masks outside are now compulsory in Tanzania so these have been essential for people to carry out basic tasks like collecting water or even to prepare and cook food on a fire outside their house. Most families have little or no cash income so have no ability to buy these items. Our team have also been teaching children and families about ways in which they can prevent the spread of the virus and how to identify symptoms. These families don't have access to televisions or the internet so we have to visit their homes to spread the word.

Schools have been closed for several weeks but are likely to be open again in early July — this is a real worry as the virus is still spreading and social distancing is impossible in overcrowded schools. Singino has up to 170 in one classroom! Some of the money you donated will be used to fund basic handwashing devices to be placed outside each classroom — I've attached a photo of one we have recently purchased.

The masks we give out are made by a women's group based in our community centre – they use foot operated sewing machines and have made nearly 1,500 masks in the last few weeks. They were taught to sew 2 years ago by a lady who lives in Harnham.

I would love to come back in to your school when it is safe to do so and tell the children about the incredible difference their fundraising has made.
